

<u>DURING LENT...WE PRAY:</u> We have now entered the solemn season of Lent when we are asked to do 3 things to help us prepare for the wonderful feast of Easter: Pray, fast, give. This week, we are focussing on our own prayers so that we can go grow closer to God. Father Paul and Father Moses invited our families to an early 8.15 a.m. Mass this morning in our book den. It was a beautiful and intimate service and we focused our thoughts and prayer on colour in creation. Of course we did, it's Rainbow Friday! Thank you to our parents, grandparents and parishoners who joined us. As always though, the children shone the brightest with their colourful responses to Father's questions. We will be having Mass each Friday and everyone is very welcome to join us.





<u>SHOW ENCOURAGEMENT:</u> There are times when we all need encouraging: that is, to be inspired with courage and to have our hope renewed, especially when we are going through difficult times. The snapshot of Jesus' glory in this Sunday's Gospel was an encouragement to the three disciples. For the first time they received a glimpse of the awesome divinity of Jesus. But soon they would go through difficult times and see Jesus crucified. So beforehand, God tells them to listen to Jesus and allows them to see Jesus for who he really is. Following Jesus isn't easy: it never was. But if, like the disciples, we too listen to Jesus, we will experience the encouragement that God offers freely to each one of us - today.

<u>CURRICULUM NEWS</u>: It's been a really busy start to this half term already with the children starting some of their new topics! To highlight just a few examples....The Nursery children witnessed 6 chicks hatching from their eggs! They were able to do some fabulous maths work as they counted on and back within 6 as well as some science work related to the life cycle of a chick! The Year 2 class started their next RSE topic called 'Being Safe' all about staying safe online. They even learnt a new song to help them to learn how to stay safe whilst using the internet. The Year 3 children used clay to create some Roman pottery and built upon their sketching skills learnt in Year 2 to add shading and texture whilst drawing Roman pottery.

WORLD BOOK DAY: What a fantastic success yet again this year! Our theme was....'Not all heroes wear capes!' and the staff were blown away by the creativity and thought that had gone into making the costumes this year. It was lovely to see that the children were able to recognise famous people, who are now household names, that have done heroic things in the past or present. Many they have read about in books and were able to talk about why these characters have inspired them. But what was even nicer to see was that the children were able to recognise the heroes around them in their every day lives. We had children and staff dressed up as medical professionals, police officers, charity workers, activists, armed services personnel, volunteers, builders, parents and a school caretaker...the list was endless! Well done to the winners in each class and we hope all of the children enjoy spending their £1 book token on a book of their choice. <u>PACKED LUNCHES:</u> We pride ourselves on being a healthy school and therefore we have always pledged that meals in school should be healthy meals. In the past, we have done workshops with parents who prefer to provide their child with a packed lunch. This is entirely parental choice. We ask, that parents work with us to ensure that, like the children who have school meals, our packed lunch children also have a healthy lunch. For example, all parents and children have always known that fizzy drinks are not allowed as part of a packed lunch; only water or milk. Sweet treats should be kept to an absolute minimum of one small treat in the packed lunch.

WATER BOTTLES: This is a gentle reminder for everyone really. Let's work together to ensure that our children are remembering to be hygienic. Staff are finding that water bottles are being left in school over the weekends and during holidays. Children need to bring them home and get them washed out with hot and soapy water. Let's keep the those germs and bugs at bay!
