

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**'TRUST IN GOD':** In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus begins to prepare his disciples for his departure from the world. Jesus is returning to his Father and will make a place ready for each of them in heaven. Jesus tells the disciples to trust in him. No amount of worrying will increase their safety or comfort; it's through trusting in Jesus that they will find security and hope. We too are called to trust in Jesus. It means being Christ in the world around us, generously sharing the love he brings into our own lives with those we meet. This isn't easy - it never was - but trust in Jesus and see what happens!

**READING TOP TIP:** Our top tip this week is: **I READ...YOU READ...WE READ!** If your child is a fluent reader or even learning to read, you can still share the fun and enjoyment of reading! Why not take it turns to read pages or even sentences? If they're still learning to read and the text is a bit tricky, try reading a sentence and pointing to the words and ask your child to repeat after you. Or even read the text together at the same time and at the same pace! This is a great way to model fluency (reading smoothly without any errors).

**CURRICULUM NEWS:** Although the children have only been in school for 3 days this week, they've been really busy with their learning. The Reception children have been learning the basics for invasion games like netball and basketball. They have been practising how to bounce a ball into a hoop whilst learning key skills like team work and resilience. The Year 4 children loved their Art morning with Mrs Philips! They studied a local artist called Baiba Auria and recalled sketching skills learnt in previous years to create self portraits in her style showing facial expressions. During their DT lesson this week, the Year 3 children explored how shadow puppets work and learnt how pulleys and gears are used to manipulate them. 
