> Our statement to live by next week is: "I STAND UP FOR PEOPLE WHO ARE BEING TREATED UNFAIRLY."

Thank you to all parents, carers and pupils who have embraced the revised arrangements for drop off and collection at the start and end of the school day. We will continue to practise and work together this half term to ensure the arrangements are embedded in readiness for September. As a reminder, the school gates will open for drop off at 8:40 a.m. and close at 8:50 a.m. for all pupils. Any latecomers must report to the school office to have their child signed in. At home time, the gates will open at 3:15 p.m. for collection of all pupils.



BE SELFLESS: In this Sunday's Gospel, like teachers of that time, Jesus uses blunt language to grab his disciples' attention and promises unlimited rewards for even the smallest act of kindness, like giving someone a cup of water. However, following Jesus would certainly have meant making some very difficult decisions for his disciples at that time. Through this Gospel, Jesus is encouraging his disciples to be selfless - to give him first place in their lives. They are to forget about themselves and to put others' needs before their own - to be selfless.

This message is for each one of us today. Selflessness is part of everyday life. We prove our love by our actions - it is selflessness which makes people truly great, warmly remembered and deeply loved. The happiest people are actually those who are selfless and serve others. St Teresa of Calcutta (Mother Teresa) reminds us:

"We will be the happiest people in the world if we belong to God, if we place ourselves at his disposal, if we let him use us as he pleases."

The week began with a beautiful First Holy Communion Mass on Sunday and it was was wonderful to see the children looking so radiant in their outfits. <u>END OF YEAR SCHOOL TRIPS</u>: Everyone is getting very excited for the end of year school trips! Parents will be aware that all trips have been heavily subsidised by school and for budgeting purposes, the governors have decided that a reduced cost of £10 will be the cap for every pupil in Years 1-5. The deadline for payments has already passed and for those that still need to make payment, they can do so on Pay360. Thank you to all parents/carers for supporting the staff in school with our 'Trip'le A challenge. <u>CURRICULUM NEWS:</u> Yet again... a very busy week in the curriculum and the enrichment of the curriculum we have to offer at St. Edmund's. The Year 4, 5 and 6 pupils were treated to a question and answer session with some real life judges who visited the school on Monday. The Urban Crew were out and about at Sharston Recycling Centre on Wednesday and they were given a greater insight into where our recycling products go before they are processed. The Reception class started their topic about friendship and focussed upon how saying sorry and forgiving others forms stronger bonds and friendships that last forever!

<u>DINNER MONEY:</u> For those parents who pay for school meals, please remember that dinner money needs to be paid in advance by <u>Monday morning</u> on Pay360. Dinner money for the remainder of the term is £35.25 Thank you!

<u>CHANGE IS ON THE WAY!!</u>: Unfortunately Pay360, our online payment system, is being withdrawn by the company at the end of July. This means that we will have to move over to a new payment system before the end of term in order to be ready for September. More information about how to register will be sent out shortly. Please keep an eye out and register as soon as possible so that you are ready for the start of the new school year.

<u>PRICE INCREASE</u>: From September, the price of a school meal will be £2.45 per day, £12.25 per week. The menus for September are attached. Please note that there is also a choice of sandwiches or jacket potatoes available each day. If you wish your child to move from packed lunch to school meals, or vice versa, please let the school office know as soon as possible.

<u>UNIVERSAL INFANT FREE SCHOOL MEALS:</u> As you are aware, children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are provided with a free school meal each day as part of the government's Universal Free School Meals initiative.

This means that children who are currently in the Nursery 2 class will no longer pay for meals when they move to the Reception class in September. Please can you make sure that any dinner money arrears are cleared before the end of term.

This also means that children who are currently in Year 2 will need to pay for their meals from September when they move into Year 3.

<u>FSM VOUCHERS</u>: The Council has approved funding for supermarket vouchers for children eligible for free school meals (FSM) for the Summer break to help with the financial pressures placed on many of our families at this time. This will be a one off payment of £55.00 issued to parents in the last week of term. This can be redeemed at a supermarket of your choice. Please contact the school office before the break if you have any problems accessing the voucher.

<u>CONSULTATIONS</u>: At this time of year, our governors like to evaluate and review how well our school is doing and what we need to do to improve. They want to hear from parents, children and staff. Therefore, please take this opportunity to click on the link and be part of our evaluation. <u>READING BOOKS</u>: In order for the teaching staff to allocate your child to the correct reading book band in September, reading books will be collected in from Wednesday 12th July. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.


