NATHANIEL SHANI: As you will know, a past pupil of ours, Nathaniel Shani lost his life last Friday in the most tragic of circumstances. Nathaniel was a bright and popular young man who had a large group of friends. Just like our current children now, his parents brought him to St. Edmund's as a baptised Catholic so that he could grow in faith and have a relationship with God. He was with us from Nursery, he made his First Holy Communion with his friends, he was a member of our leadership teams in Year 5, he was our Music Monitor in Year 6. He wore our school jumper, with our school badge, he said our prayers, he learnt his lessons in our classrooms, he played with his friends in our play ground, he was an ambassador for our school. We were proud of him. He will always be a St. Edmund's child. May he rest in peace.





<u>BE GENEROUS</u>: In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus uses the images of workers and a vineyard to show us something about the kingdom of Heaven and God's generosity. God's ways are not our ways. At first, it may appear unfair that the workers who started early were only paid the same as those who arrived later. But, on reflection, we see that not only was the Landowner being fair by paying what had been agreed, he was being overly generous through rewarding everyone equally (even those who came at the last hour). God's generosity is unlimited and offered to each one of us.

THE SEASON OF CREATION: The season of creation is an annual international ecumenical initiative. It started on 1st September, the Day of Prayer for Creation, and ends on 4th October, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi the patron saint of ecology. So we are called to join the river of justice and peace, to take up climate and ecological justice, and to speak out with and for communities most impacted by climate injustice and the loss of biodiversity.



• Please follow the one way system when coming onto and leaving the premises


• Please reverse park into a spare parking bay in order to ensure better peripheral vision when leaving


