## WEEKEND MASSES - Come to the table, everyone is welcome!


Saturday: Vigil Mass -6.30 p.m. at St. Malachy's

<u>ONLINE-SAFETY TOP TIP:</u> Our top tip this week is: **STRIVE FOR BALANCE IN YOUR HOUSEHOLD** 

- Encourage your child to balance their screen time and green time, and encourage offline interests.
- Be wary of health problems from overusing technology (eyesight, posture, hearing, and so on.).

There are many guidelines floating around but perhaps there isn't really an arbitrary answer when parents or educators ask, "How much time should children spend on screens?"

Perhaps it depends on what the child is actually doing. Creating and purposefully connecting online is clearly more beneficial than long stretches of passive viewing. Additionally, using technology collaboratively at suitable times is clearly better than using inappropriate apps or sites alone late at night or when other tasks (or sleep!) are a priority. So a shift in conversation to quality over quantity may be helpful as a family.

IT'S BEGINNING TO LOOK A LOT LIKE CHRISTMAS!!: Well it certainly has started to look a little bit like Christmas this week as it was time for a pantomime or two! Firstly, the children in EYFS and Key Stage 1 had a special treat on Wednesday. The actors, actresses and theatre came to us and set themselves up in the school hall. KEEP THOSE WINTER BUGS AT BAY!: As we go into winter, common illnesses can keep children and teenagers away from their classmates and studies. One of the best things we can all do to avoid illness is to practice good hand hygiene. Good hand hygiene helps stop infections from spreading, which means less disrupted learning time. Teach your child to wash hands properly for 20 seconds and stay away from others when sick. The e-bug resources for all ages can help you to explain and discuss hygiene habits and why they are important - to your child or teenager. To avoid catching bugs or passing it on to others wash your hands frequently and thoroughly



with soap and warm water. This is most important following an episode of diarrhoea or vomiting, after using the toilet, before eating or preparing food, after changing nappies, as well as cleaning up vomit or diarrhoea. Alcohol-based hand sanitisers are not effective against some infections. Anyone who has diarrhoea and/or vomiting should stay at home. Do not return to work or send children to school until 48 hours after the symptoms have stopped and do not visit your GP or hospital while symptomatic. 
