

TAKE TIME TO CARE: During this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of 'The Lost Sheep.' He tells us this parable to show us that the Kingdom of God is accessible to all of us, even when we sin or have strayed from God's path. He uses the example of a shepherd (God) who has 100 sheep and one goes missing. The shepherd leaves the 99 others and searches high and low for the one lost sheep - the sinner. Jesus loves us and cares for us - just like a good shepherd cares for all the sheep - and His message is that He wants us to care for others and God's creation because we are <u>all</u> special in God's eyes. The images of seeking, finding and rejoicing act as symbols of God's care and unconditional love - the care we often experience through the actions of the people around us. READING TOP TIP: Our top tip this week is...ESTABLISH A READING ROUTINE:- Every child in the school will have brought home their new reading book and reading record this week. Now that the holidays are over, encourage your child to make time to read regularly at some time during the evening. Research shows that 20 minutes reading each day will greatly enhance a child's progress.

BREAKFAST CLUB: We are delighted to continue with our offer to support working parents again this year. Our daily Breakfast Club will be available from 8:00 a.m. until 8:30 a.m. to enable working parents that little bit extra time to get to work on time. <u>AFTER SCHOOL SPORTS:</u> We are thrilled to be working with the coaches from Sports First Coaching again this year in order to provide the children with some high-quality P.E. provision in addition to the P.E. lessons taught during curriculum time. We are even more excited because this year we have been able to extend the provision to our Key Stage 1 pupils as well as our Key Stage 2 pupils! The sessions will start during the week commencing **Monday**, 19th September.

YEAR 4 SWIMMING: Swimming lessons for Year 4 children will now take place on a Monday morning starting on Monday, 12th September. This is an important aspect of the National Curriculum and one in which Year 4 children must take part except for exceptional medical reasons. The children will be leaving school at 9:05 a.m. prompt in order to arrive at the swimming baths on time. Any parents who have not returned their form of consent will need to send this into school on Monday morning.





<u>ST. MATTHEW'S VISIT TO YEAR 6:</u> On Thursday, 15th September, we will be welcoming some staff and ex pupils from our feeder high school -St. Matthew's. They will be delivering a special lesson to our Year 6 pupils in the morning and the children will be bringing home some information about some Open Mornings/Evenings later in the half term.

PARENT/TEACHER MEETINGS: The teachers are really looking forward to meeting the parents of the pupils in their respective classes. Therefore, parents will have the opportunity to attend a meeting on Tuesday, 13th September at either 3:30 p.m, 4:30 p.m or 5:30 p.m. Mrs Clinton will start each meeting in the school hall and then parents will be able to go to their child's classroom to meet the teacher. These meetings are really important as it gives the teachers the opportunity to discuss our partnership in teaching and nurturing our children as well as systems and routines within each individual class.
