



READING TOP TIP: Our top tip this week is: CHANGE YOUR VOICE FOR EACH CHARACTER. If reading a book aloud with your child, try becoming some or all of the characters in the story! Change your voice for the characters. You can speak in a whisper for a shy mouse. You can speak angrily. You can speak in a loud silly voice. You can speak in a quiet voice. Even when you have only one character, have fun changing your voice. This will make the story more entertaining and help your child understand which characters are talking. As a bonus, you will be helping your child learn new words, such as shyly, angrily, happily, and sadly, because children will match your tone of voice to the words in the book and to the pictures on the pages.

<u>SCARLET FEVER</u>: Scarlet fever is on the rise again! The first signs of scarlet fever can be flu-like symptoms, including a high temperature, a sore throat and swollen neck glands (a large lump on the side of your neck). A rash appears 12 to 48 hours later. It looks looks like small, raised bumps and starts on the chest and tummy, then spreads. It is highly contagious and is spread by close contact with someone carrying the bacteria. It takes around 2 to 5 days to develop symptoms after exposure to these bacteria. If you think you or your child has scarlet fever, you should consult your GP.

AVAILABLE PLACES: We currently have spaces in most of our classes. Some families think that they aren't eligible to come to our school. We often hear, 'We can't come to your school because we aren't Catholic.' This isn't actually true. Baptised children are given priority when we have spaces but all families and children are welcome at our school. Please spread the word - your family and friends are very welcome!





NURSERY PLACES: We will shortly be arranging nursery admissions for January 2023. If your child is born between 01.09.2019 - 31.12.2019, please contact the school office as soon as possible to ensure we have your child's details.

<u>school MEALs:</u> The price of a school meal is £2.35 per day / £11.75 per week. Please make every effort to pay a week in advance through Pay360 (formally SIMSPay). Dinner money should not be more than 2 weeks in arrears. If you are struggling to pay, please contact the school office to discuss the matter. Please remember to inform the admin staff if you wish to make any changes to your child's meals arrangements. Two weeks' notice should be given if they are changing from school meals to bringing their own packed lunch.





<u>COMMUNICATION</u>: For those parents who have yet to complete the contact update form, please return it to school as soon as possible. Spare forms are available from the school office. Whilst our Admin Team process all of the forms, the weekly newsletter will continue to go home as a hard copy with each child on a Friday afternoon. <u>ATTENTION YEAR 6 PARENTS:</u> It is now time to apply for your child's Year 7 place at high school. Go to Manchester.gov.uk/admissions to apply. The deadline for secondary school applications is **Monday**, 31st October and the message is... 'Don't leave it too late!' If you need help, please get in touch with your child's class teacher and we can support you.

<u>PARENTS' EVENING:</u> Further to the 'Meet the Teacher' meetings a couple of weeks ago, parents will have the opportunity to make an individual appointment with their child's class teacher for <u>Wednesday</u>, 12th <u>October</u>. The teachers will be able to report on how well your child has settled in this academic year and discuss individual targets to support your child's progress. A five minute appointment between 3:30-6:30 p.m. can be made and the teachers will continue to be out on the playground after school on Monday and Tuesday next week so that parents can make an appointment that is most convenient for them. Alternatively, make a phone call to the office and the staff will be able to slot you in for a suitable time to suit you.



<u>COFFEE MORNING</u>: We will be holding a Coffee Morning on Wednesday, 19th October and all parents and carers are welcome to attend from 9:00 a.m. - 10:30 a.m. We will be particularly interested to hear about any ideas that parents/carers may have to support families with the cost of living crisis.
