To highlight just a few examples...as part of their science topic on 'Animals including Humans' the Year 1 class have been identifying the different features of animals, the Nursery class have been making pumpkin soup as part of their design technology topic and the Year 4 class composed and performed their own firework song using some of the colours that they have learnt in German! ATTENTION YEAR 1, 2 AND 3 PARENTS: Do you know about one of our free online learning platforms called Numbots? Numbots is an online game and playing little and often will significantly improve your child's recall and understanding of number bonds and addition and subtraction facts. These are critical foundations in maths so we are excited about the impact that Numbots will have. The children have been shown how to login and have brought home a username label inside their reading record. This is the same username and password that they use for Mathletics and Times Tables Rock Stars. There's nothing stopping our older children in the school from joining in too!
