Thank you to all parents, carers and pupils who have embraced the revised arrangements for drop off and collection at the start and end of the school day. We will continue to practise and work together for one more week to ensure the arrangements are embedded in readiness for September. As a reminder, the school gates will open for drop off at 8:40 a.m. and close at 8:50 a.m. for **all pupils**. Any latecomers must report to the school office to have their child signed in. At home time, the gates will open at 3:15 p.m. for collection of **all pupils**.



LISTENING: Children love to be listened to and it helps them to grow in self-esteem. If, from a young age, they know that we truly listen to them, they are far more likely to keep listening to us as they mature. IMPORTANT FINANCE MATTERS:

DINNER MONEY: For those parents who pay for school meals, please remember that dinner money needs to be paid in advance by **Monday morning** on Pay360. Dinner money for the remainder of the term is £11.75. Thank you!

SCHOOL GATEWAY: As you are aware, Pay360, our online payment system, is being withdrawn by the company. This means that we are moving over to School Gateway and ask that you register before the end of term in order to be ready for September. More information has already been sent out this week so please check your emails and register as soon as possible.

PRICE INCREASES: From September, the price of a school meal will be £2.45 per day, £12.25 per week. The menus for September are attached. Please note that there is also a choice of sandwiches or jacket potatoes available each day. If you wish your child to move from packed lunch to school meals, or vice versa, please let the school office know as soon as possible.

BREAKFAST CLUB: Unfortunately, we need to increase the cost of our breakfast club as well. It has been £2.00 a day now for many years but governors can no longer sustain this level of subsidy. From September, the cost of breakfast club will be £3.00 per day which works out at £15.00. This increase is still being subsidised from our school budget and is still cheaper than using private child-care arrangements.

UNIVERSAL INFANT FREE SCHOOL MEALS: As you are aware, children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are provided with a free school meal each day as part of the government's Universal Free School Meals initiative.

This means that children who are currently in the Nursery 2 class will no longer pay for meals when they move to the Reception class in September. Please can you make sure that any dinner money arrears are cleared before the end of term.

This also means that children who are currently in Year 2 will need to pay for their meals from September when they move into Year 3.

Free school meal **VOUCHERS**

FSM VOUCHERS: The Council has approved funding for supermarket vouchers for children eligible for free school meals (FSM) for the Summer break to help with the financial pressures placed on many of our families at this time. This will be a one off payment of £55.00 issued to parents in the last week of term. This can be redeemed at a supermarket of your choice. Please contact the school office before the break if you have any problems accessing the voucher.

DREADING THE 6 WEEK HOLIDAYS?! The Summer holidays are fast approaching. MCRactive and Manchester City Council are offering thousands of **FREE** places for children eligible for benefits-related free school meals. Activities will range from Sport and Physical Activities, Arts and Crafts and much more. In addition to the activities, their booked place will include a **FREE** meal during the day.

You will need to sign up for an MCRactive Go account <https://www.mcractive.com/> (sign in) to book free Summer Holiday activities. Once signed up, log into your account - [Find Activities](#) - Search by Category 'MCR Holiday Activity' - **Use code: 64894** to book free eligible activities. You can also visit <https://loadstodo.co.uk/> to view additional FREE holiday activities and other opportunities taking place across the city.

Please note that the system will only show sessions 6 weeks in advance, so you may need to log back in at a later date to make further bookings.

*Please only book your child onto a holiday camp if they will be attending. Spaces at each camp are limited. If you book a space and your child can no longer attend, please cancel your space as far in advance as possible, to allow the opportunity for another child to take their space at the activity and free meal.


