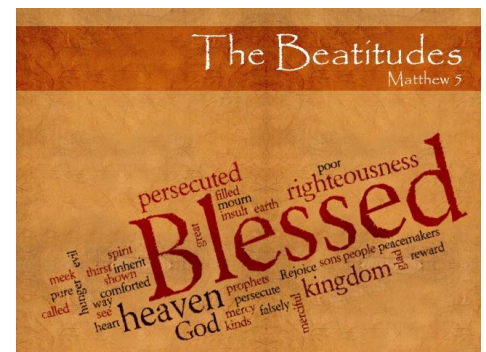
WEEKEND MASSES - Come to the table, everyone is welcome!

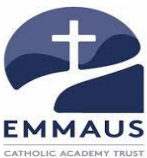
READING TOP TIP: This week's reading top tip is: 'VISIT A LOCAL LIBRARY WITH YOUR CHILD.'

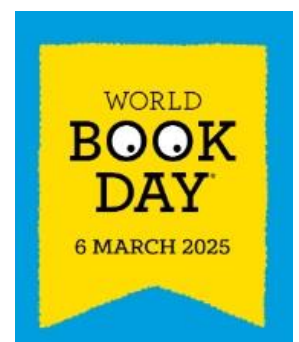
ONLINE SAFETY: Our digital leaders have been raising awareness about keeping ourselves safe online this week. Below is a really useful link for parents/carers to click on.

COST OF LIVING - WINTER FUEL PAYMENTS: Do you need help now to keep warm, but you didn't get a winter fuel payment? The changes to the winter fuel allowance have caused a lot of discussion and some worry. So, we wanted to make parents/carers and families aware of some help that is available on the Manchester City Council website.



Manchester City Council is making payments up to the end of March of £150-£200 to people who are aged 66 and over who live in Manchester and who do not receive housing benefit or council tax support. The form is quick and easy to fill in and you won't be asked anything about any savings. This is the link: <https://www.manchester.gov.uk/winterfuelfund>. Payments will be made as promptly as possible to bank accounts or through post office vouchers. You will need to give contact details and your National Insurance number. Family members can make an application on your behalf. Or, if you need help filling in the form, please call for free on their cost of living advice line on 0800 023 2692.

Any accounts with arrears need to be cleared before **Friday, 21st February**. If you are struggling to pay, please speak to the school office and a payment plan can be arranged. If arrears are not cleared your child will need to have packed lunches until they are.
