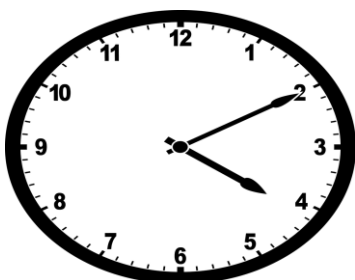
YEAR 5 - FUTURE PUPIL LEADERS: Mrs Clinton spoke to the Year 5 pupils yesterday about the process they will go through to apply for their prefect roles in September. They will need to write letters of application for the positions they wish to take. They will then perhaps be invited to an interview where they will be questioned about their choices and why they are the best applicant. She will be assessing their leadership qualities against our Gospel Values and life skills, as well as testing their knowledge and understanding of protected characteristics regarding equality.

DONATIONS TO TRIPS: To give advance notice to parents/carers, we are anticipating that most trips will cost at least £15.00 (maybe more!) a child this year. Transport costs continue to be astronomical. By giving you this advance notice, we do hope that you can plan and save for the trips. As soon as the cost of the trip has been calculated, we will inform parents. A great way to get children to 'earn' this treat would be to give little chores around the house so they can make a contribution to the trip themselves.



READING TOP TIP: Our top tip this week is: Enjoy bedtime stories. Read with your child at bedtime as often as you can. It's a great way to end the day and to spend valuable time with them. Sharing a book at bedtime helps develop your child's vocabulary, gets them used to the idea of regular reading, and gives you both a great opportunity to bond.

ONLINE SAFETY: Talking regularly with your child can help keep them safe online. Making it part of daily conversation, like you would about their day at school, will help your child feel relaxed. It also means when they do have any worries, they're more likely to come and speak to you. But it's easy to become overwhelmed with the different technology, the language that children use, the huge number of games and apps which are available and the potential risks. If this is something you'd like some support with, please have a word with your child's teacher.



AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS: This is a reminder to all parents/carers whose children attend after school club. Our club finishes at 4.15 p.m. and we do not have staffing capacity after this time. This means we expect parents to be here, ready to collect at 4.15 p.m. If parents are late collecting on two occasions, their child will lose their place. Thank you for your co-operation. Now that the evenings are longer, children in Years 3-6 are able to walk home but parents must phone the office to authorise this.

YEAR 6 RESIDENTIAL: This is a reminder to Y6 parents that the Y6 residential is costing £300. We urge you to start making payments, no matter how small so that you aren't left to make a large payment in June. The deadline for paying the balance isn't far away now - Monday, 2nd June.

GOVERNANCE: We have received two nominations from parents who would like to serve on our new Local Governing Board. Mrs Clinton will be writing to parents next week about the voting process.

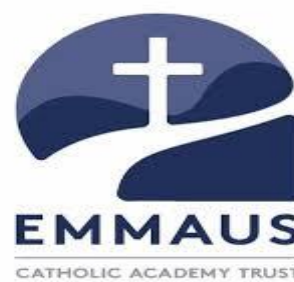
