GREAT NEWS FROM THE VATICAN!

A new pope has been announced! Cardinal Robert Prevost will be the 267th pope, becoming the head of the worldwide Catholic Church and history's first ever North American pope. His name was announced after Cardinal Mamberti spoke the words, 'Habemus papami!', Latin for 'We have a new pope!' His appointment was revealed yesterday evening from the Sistene Chapel in Rome, confirming the news to the world! Catholics across the world are celebrating the news!! Pope Leo XIV's first words to us were, 'Let's stay united and hand and hand with God as we move forward together.'
