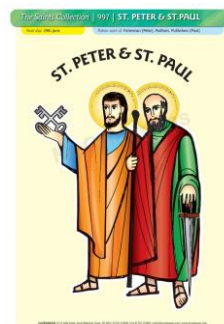
WEEKEND MASSES – Come to the table, everyone is welcome!

CHURCH: This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of Saint Peter and Saint Paul who did great work for the Church. Both of these men were Apostles who met with Jesus and were given authority to build Jesus' Church on earth. Jesus established His Church as a reminder of God's love for all people – that includes you and me too. In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus asks the disciples, "Who do you say I am?" Peter realises the truth about Jesus and professes his faith in Jesus as the Christ – the Son of the living God. Jesus then gives Peter the important task of leading the Church. The procession has been a fixture in the Ancoats community for over a century and is a cherished tradition. We are delighted that our Parish will be walking and everyone is invited.
