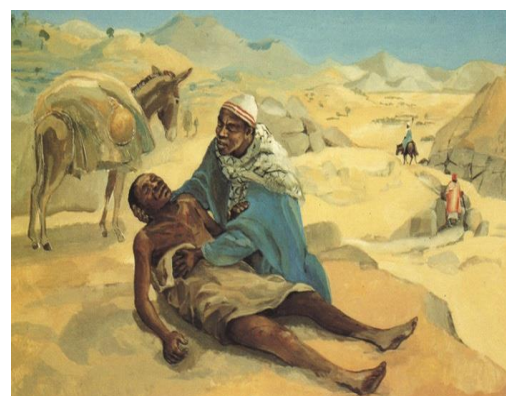


### WEEKEND MASSES - Come to the table, everyone is welcome!

Our 'Statement to Live by' next week is:  
'I understand the importance of peace.'

**NEIGHBOUR:** Loving God and our neighbours is the foundation of a good life, but it is only through loving God first that we are really able to love our neighbours as God intends. Who is our neighbour? In this Sunday's Gospel we read about the Good Samaritan. Through this parable, Jesus answers a question from a lawyer and tells us that our neighbour is any person who needs our help, regardless of who they are or where they come from. At the end of the Gospel, Jesus then tells the lawyer to go and act as the Good Samaritan did. It's a message for us today. Who will I be a good neighbour to this week? Enjoy a very special time together this weekend, hearing your child's thoughts about this Sunday's Gospel and this week's word, which is NEIGHBOUR.

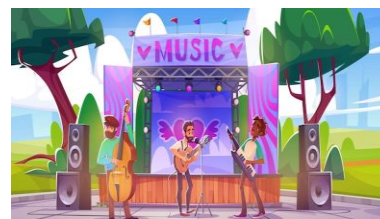
